Eligibility





- 1. Minimum age of participation is age 14, born in or before 2003.
- 2. In each individual class, each country may enter a maximum of 5 competitors. All entries must be made through the respective Federations.
- 3. In each relay class, each country may enter 2 teams in each class but only the better placed team will be counted in the prize list.
- 4. Competitors representing member Federations of the IOF, defined by the International Olympic Committee as belonging to the Asian continent, can compete in AsJYOC.
- 5. Competitors representing other member Federations of IOF or other Asian countries can participate in AsJYOC but will not be eligible for the AsJYOC titles, medals or diplomas.
- 6. The winners of the age class 20 will be the Asian Junior Champions, and the winners of the age classes 18 and 16 will be Asian Youth Champions respectively.
- 7. If a Federation is unable to make up full relay teams (even with women running in men's classes), it may form incomplete teams or mixed teams with runners from other Federations. Under no circumstances may persons other than entered competitors participate in the competitions. Teams with runners from more than one Federation are not placed on the official result list.

8. Technical Information

Sprint

Venue: Two River & One Holy Mountain Scenic Spot

Mapper: Mr.Ma Yuanyuan

Course Setter: Mr.Liangfangyong

Map scale and Contour Interval: 1:5, 000 with 2m contour interval

Terrain Descriptions: Urban park and village. Urban Park with lawn and also traditional village with irregular buildings. Excellent in runnabilty and visibility.

Middle Distance

Venue: West Mountain

Mapper: Mr. Lin Yang

Course Setter: Mr. Fangyong Liang

Map scale and Contour Interval: 1:10,000 with 2.5m contour interval **Terrain Descriptions:** A moderately hilly area consists of plateau, marshes, semi-open areas, open areas and woodland. There are areas with vegetation of slow run, walk and fight. Various rocky formations and stones are found





on the slopes. There are some thorny weeds inside the undergrowth. Paths might have been created temporarily by grazing cattle.

• Sprint Relay

Venue: Two River & One Holy Mountain Scenic Spot

Mapper: Mr. Shouzhen MA

Course Setter: Mr. Fangyong Liang

Map scale and Contour Interval: 1:5,000 with 2m contour interval Terrain Descriptions: Mixed with low density blocks and garden areas.

Mainly covered by paved area with scatter of open land. Excellent

runnability & good visibility.

9. Clothing

For middle distance event, competitors must wear clothing that fully covers their body and legs.

It is forbidden to use shoes with spikes in sprint relay and sprint competitions.

11.Entries

All entries which are eligible for AsJYOC must be made through the respective Federations. Entry forms are available on the OAC website. Deadline for entries is on July 31.





Individual entries not making through their respective Federations will not be accepted.

12.VISA

All preparing forms for China visas including application (not HongKong, Macau and Chinese Taipei) will be available from the official website of the Orienteering Association of China. Deadline for completing or making changes to the application forms and names of participants is July 31. The organizers will provide visa invitations to the national federations upon receipt of the team member personal and passport details (copy of passport, profession and occupation, location of submitting visa application and so on),please information form download the on OAC website http://oacn.sport.org.cn.

13.Entry fees

Asian Youth Orienteering Championships 2017

Registration Fee: ¥ 300/pp (including program, bag, souvenir shirt, number plate, event ID, medal, mascot, certificate, trophies for the first three places)

Accommodation:¥ 1100/pp(Aug. 20-25, 5 nights)

Dining: ¥ 600/pp (Aug. 20-25, 10 meals)
